

Those riders, all MMOC members were Dennis Brown, Terry Blumenthal, Ed Callejas, Al Hom, Cliff Heanes and Phil Ponzo. Teresa and Chuck Rabaut also rode down on their twin HDs from Pismo Beach

We were there to observe the trials but more importantly, we were there in an attempt to recruit new members. We were met by a number of MMOC members from So-Cal who were all part of the recruitment effort. Some of the members of the MMOC Honor Guard were there including Don Winslow, Pasadena PD retired, Kevin Cotter and Jason Clause, both still active motor officers with LAPD, Steve Ellis, LAPD retired, and Pat Armstrong, Santa Monica PD retired, Past President JJ Leonard was there and Baron Laetzsch, LAPD retired rode in from Arizona. Also helping was Past President Gene Gray, Pasadena PD retired and George Wiley, Pasadena PD retired. There were five different events that the motor officers competed in. The state was well represented with Departments from as far south as National City and as far north as San Jose competing. Each event was different from the others and required different skills. I personally enjoyed each and every event and marveled at how well each and every rider did in the competition. Congratulations to all!

The winners were:

- The Four Man Team competition was won by Carlsbad & San Jose PDs. Second place was won by Simi Valley and National City.
- The Tennis Ball Rally winners were Glendale PD Officers Lindner and Malouf and second place was won by CHP Officers Enger and Cooper.
- The Tandem winners were a carbon copy of the Tennis Ball Rally. First Place went to Glendale Officers Malouf and Linder and second place went to CHP Officers Enger and Cooper.
- The Individual Competition first place trophy went to Eddie Chan of San Jose PD with an excellent time of 145.125. Second place went to Lucky Nguyen of National City PD with a time of 146.31 and third place went to Shawn Lawton of Carlsbad PD with a time of 147.723.
- The winning Top Gun Rider was John Watkins, Pasadena, PD, second place went to Craig Blumenthal, Pasadena PD and third place went to Paul Menchaca, LAPD.

There are many of these competitions throughout the State. The MMOC should be at all of them because recruitment should be our most important endeavor. 

MMOC Honor Guard

The Honor Guard was initially formed by Don Winslow (Pasadena P. D., Retired and 50 year member of the MMOC) in 2001. At that point they had 8 volunteers from Pasadena, Santa Monica, and Los Angeles. By word of mouth it slowly grew over the years to what it is today.

The Honor Guard began by leading a few Parades in Southern California. Shortly after its beginning Don contacted the current President of the MMOC, Gene Gray, proposing they ride for our organization. The plan went through and the rest is history.

While representing the MMOC the Honor Guard members wear "MMOC uniforms" (P. D. uniforms with an MMOC shoulder patch). In addition lead Honor Guard, Pat Armstrong (Retired Santa Monica), carries a fourteen foot flag pole with the American flag on it, which is a favorite. In addition Kevin Cotter (LAPD) rides his 1942 LAPD Harley Davidson wearing the uniform from that period. Each member supplies his personal Police motorcycle and donates all expenses incurred on behalf of the MMOC and its cause.

Since teaming up with the MMOC the Honor Guard has lead Parades in the Pindorado Parade, Cambria - the Morro Bay Parade, the 'Ol Miner's Day parade in Big Bear, Fourth of July Parade plus the Veteran's Memorial Parade in La Verne, the Holiday Parade in Laguna Niguel, and the list goes on. Many of these entities have earned the Honor Guard 1st place honors and trophies. In addition to parades, the Honor Guard represents MMOC at many Law Enforcement funerals.

As a side note, two of our Honor Guard members have received awards from our Government Agencies. While on his way to Cambria to lead the Cities Parade with the Honor Guard Officer Joe Gomez, LAPD, came across a "Jumper". Due to his quick thinking, Officer Gomez was able to confine the "Jumper" saving not only the "Jumper" but also the life of the CHP Officer on scene.

Kevin Cotter, LAPD, was invited by President Obama to the White House and Honored for his actions in a shootout. Cotter engaged and killed a murder suspect on Hollywood Blvd. after the suspect had already killed several innocent citizens which in turn saved numerous lives. Cotter was named "Top Cop" in America for his actions.
