



Retired Officer George J. Hofstetter



July 11, 1941 - February 11, 2019

George passed away February 11th at 77 years young after a long battle with pancreatic cancer. His storied history at LAPD began in 1966 shortly after he served a 4 year enlistment in the Marine Corps and saw active duty in Viet Nam. Known as Deputy Red for his crimson locks, George worked Patrol and maintained a strong and vocal presence in LAPD's Police Officers Association. That dedication to duty segued into more than 2 decades on Motors, joining MMOC in February, 1976 while he was a Drill Team Leader. George also was forever present in MMOC's Annual Conventions, particularly so in the south of the state.

Ever the patriot, George belonged to the American Legion and was a Coast Guard reservist in 1990 and 1991 when he was called up for active duty during Desert Storm, deploying to Kuwait to ward off the evils of Saddam Hussein's regime. Not fulfilled and back stateside on his Department, he completed his Coast Guard duty then joined the Army as a reservist! After nearly 27 years on LAPD and retiring off Motors in 1992, he joined the ranks of many fabled Motor Men who worked the City of Los Angeles's storied Movie Detail.

George leaves behind his wife Dorothy, daughter Vanessa and son George B. Hofstetter, himself a 29 year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, and likewise, a long tenured Motor Officer. Many likeminded compatriots who were proud to call him their friend dearly miss his presence. Rest in peace, George.

Long tenured San Jose Police Department Motor Sergeant Jerry Albericci passed away February 5, 2019, at Kaiser Hospital, Roseville, after suffering from congestive heart failure for several years. A 32-year member of San Jose's force, Jerry and his wife Robbie moved to Placerville after his retirement in 1997, where he pursued his love of riding motorcycles and building hot rod Mopars and engines.

Jerry was very active in his support of MMOC, both in the golden era original Cioppino Feeds and an ever-steady presence with Robbie on our Annual July Rides. As a senior Motor Sergeant, he always had hilarious tales to spin on many of his "colorful" minions who he "coached, guided and cajoled" to see them to retirement. Deep voiced and usually reserved, many a fable had us often in gut wrenching laughter as he described his charges, who shall remain anonymous to protect the innocent.

Jerry leaves behind his wife Robbie, daughter Kari and her husband Karl, their two children Jesse and Meghan and their other daughter Denell and husband Travis along with their two children Kelsi and Tanner.
