## **Cioppino Feed**

If you missed this year's Cioppino Feed you were not alone. WE ALL DID !!! We decided on Friday the 13th (go figure), 2 days after our Board of Directors meeting where we finalized plans for the feed, that Governor Newsome's and Santa Clara County Health official's suggestions/restrictions were not attainable. At the time of cancellation, the restriction was for gatherings of no more than 250 people. Shortly after we cancelled, that was reduced to 100 people. Below were the restrictions at the time of cancellation:

 "Non-essential gatherings must be limited to no more than 250 people, while smaller events can proceed only if the organizers can implement social distancing of 6 feet per person. Gatherings of individuals who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 should be limited to no more than 10 people, while also following social distancing guidelines." (Cont. from pg.1)

- Add distance between where individuals sit or stand around tables.
- Add additional hand washing stations and restrooms.
- Avoid direct physical contact, such as handshaking, holding hands, and hugging.

I think it is safe to say, all things being considered, we made the right choice. Those who requested refunds were mailed checks and the others told us to hold the money for next year's Cioppino Feed, which we have set for **Saturday**, **March 20**, **2021**. I would like to thank everyone who worked on this year's feed, including Rhoda Nishiyama (Brown), LaRene Hodson, Rich Baily, Kim Wirht, and Cliff Heanes. Thanks also goes out to Mark & Helen Murray who did a fantastic job of signing up 16+ people to attend (many from the Plumas County area), all of whom told us to hold their money until next year! I'll bet there are some serious partiers in that group! Can't wait to see all of them next March.

On Wednesday, 11 March 2020 we held MMOC's very first online BOD meeting, utilizing the now widely known Zoom application. ## 27TH ANNUAL RIDE - THE DALLES, OREGON

This years MMOC ride is bringing us to the Columbia River Gorge, Oregon. The Columbia River Gorge has been called as one of the most scenic areas in America for motorcycle riding with great curvy roads that are rated for all riders except a novice. I mapped out 4 different round trip routes averaging about 150 miles per day covering the areas near the Dalles. The different routes include rides that have scenic roads around Mt Hood, a ghost town, views of the high desert area and curves.

Our base for this ride will be at the Cousin's Country Inn and Restaurant in The Dalles, Oregon. Some of you might remember we stayed there in 2018. After enjoying the roads and the town of The Dalles we will leave heading west for the Evergreen Air Museum in McMinnville Oregon. We will spend Thursday night in Woodburn, OR.



I have reserved 10 rooms at each hotel. Make sure to mention Municipal Motorcycle Officers of California (or MMOC) and/or my name when making reservations. A word of caution, the establishments will only guarantee room availability up to 30 days out with a credit card transaction. Make your reservations early!

## **UPCOMING 2020 MMOC RIDE**

## Mt. HOOD & THE DALLES, OREGON

(Follow-up article to January Siren Issue)

The July 12<sup>th</sup> starting date for the ride is approaching fast. We are less than 3 months away from meeting in Klamath Falls. I hope that everyone is in good health, and that the virus will be behind us when July arrives.

I looked at 4 routes when planning the ride. All the routes had many things to offer, but after comparing the roads and the restaurants on the routes I cut it down to 2 routes.

I believe this will give us the 2 best roads. I watched a video about the northwest route first half which is a combination of long straightaways and sweepers. Farther up the road its tree lined with a few more curves which leads into the curvy corner combinations which last for several miles. The rider said pavement is fine, from the start of curvy area which was re-paved in 2017.

There are two restaurants one for each day the first one named The Cougar Lane Lodge / Rouge River Barbeque (northwest route) and the other named The Zig Zag Inn (southwest route) the latter world famous for its food, rolling papers and a large selection of Bigfoot keepsakes. I watched a short video of the southwest route it shows good roads with nice sweeping curves on highway 30.

Both routes are roughly 200 miles long and each should take about 4 to 5 hours of riding to finish and get back to the hotel.

I believe we should be at the Cousins Country Inn by no later than 3 P.M. every day.

Research of The Dalles area near our hotel found several interesting places to go. The list includes but not limited to these local establishments and several wineries. Check out The Dalles Chamber of Commerce's web site for more info.
